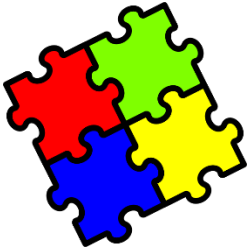

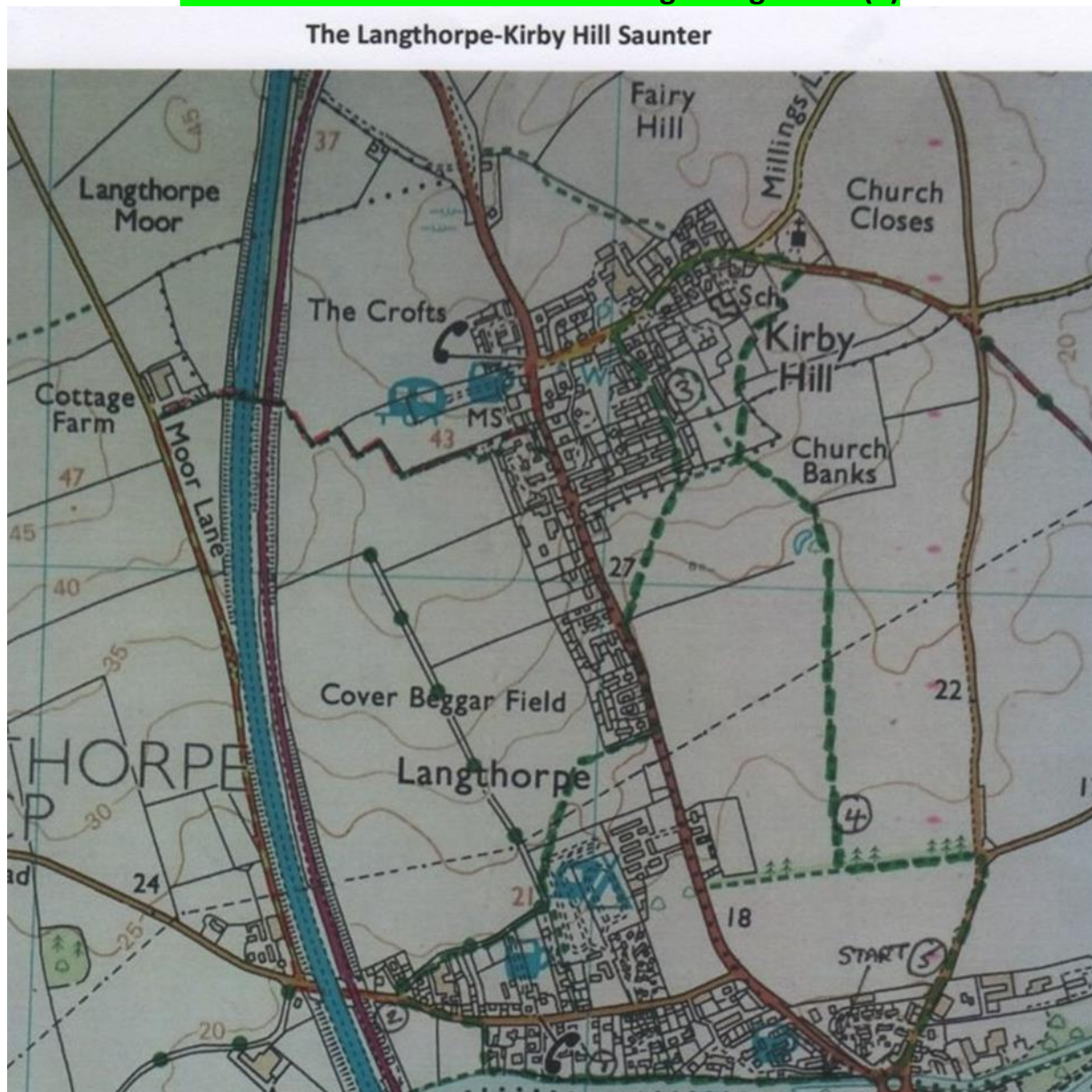
Springfield Garth EPH: Christmas Fayre

Recommended Walks in the Boroughbridge Area (4)



This is a short but very pleasant walk in attractive, accessible, local countryside

Start – Langthorpe Picnic Site Car Park – walk along the riverside path to 2 on the map, then, having crossed Skelton Road, head up Back Lane; take the path across the fields to Leeming Lane; walk a short distance along the footpath before crossing the road to the diagonal track across the fields to Kirby Hill, 3 above, eventually working your way through St John’s Walk to Church Lane; walk down to the church and take the path opposite the side gate to the church; keep to the downslope path from “Church Banks” and reach the track (4) which runs W-E alongside Hockley Croft – turn left to reach Dishforth Road; walk to finish, taking care along the road at 5 above (no footpath)

DISTANCE: 3 miles (5 km); **ESTIMATED TIME:** leisurely pace – 1 h 40 mins; brisk, exercise pace – 1 h.

POSSIBLE EXTENSIONS/ALTERNATIVES: (red dashes on map): a) cut into the “Langthorpe Loop” in Kirby Hill, cross the A1 and return via Moor Lane’ b) – at the church, carry on along Church Lane until you reach Dishforth Road; then take the “green lane” to Milby
